Memorial Day Ceremony and Veterans Memorial Dedication



We are excited to share the completed Veterans Memorial with our community!

Located across from City Hall at the intersection of W. Broad Street and Church Street, the monument was completed in late May and honors the brave men and women who have served their country. The Veterans Memorial Plaza features panels representing the six branches of military service as well as a water feature, eternal flame, and spectacular eagle statue. Community members are invited to pause and reflect as they walk or sit along the plaza surrounding the monument.

The project broke ground on the 75th anniversary of the D-Day invasion of Normandy Beach during World War II and was dedicated on Memorial Day 2020. We appreciate all who attended, both in-person and virtually, on Monday, May 25th, 2020. Representatives from The Suwanee Creek Chapter of The Daughters of the American Revolution, Sugar Hill American Legion Post 127, the Broad St. Concert Band Quintet and volunteers from Scouts BSA all played an important role in the dedication ceremony. Thank you to the The Sugar Hill Business Alliance and Am. Legion Post 127 for their contribution of funds to support the city project.

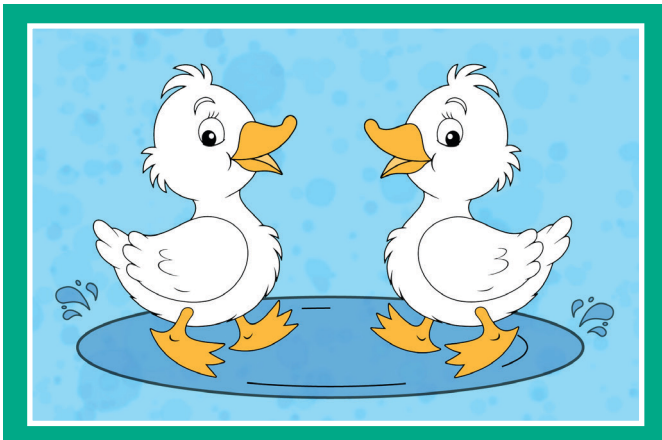
