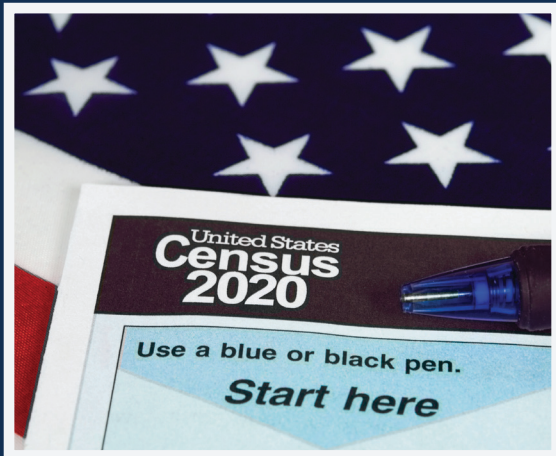

SHAPE YOUR FUTURE



Completing the census is a national tradition (and part of The United States Constitution!). Every decade since 1790, The United States has conducted a count of our current population. The census is used to determine representation in Congress and distribute \$675 billion in federal funds. Your participation in the 2020 Census will shape community funding for everything from fire departments and schools to the roads and highways we drive on every day.

Responding to the census is simple and takes just 10 minutes. Beginning in mid-March, every home will receive official Census Bureau mail with information about how to respond to the 2020 Census. You will have three options for completing the census for your household: online, by phone and by mail. All data collected as part of the census is 100% confidential.

In order to ensure a complete and accurate count for our community and our country, additional follow-up information, including a paper form, will be mailed to households who

don't complete the census within a few weeks of receiving the first mailed instructions.

You may also notice census takers in your neighborhood this year. This is a normal part of conducting the census. Your information is such an important part of the 2020 Census, that if you haven't responded on your own, census takers will visit communities to help make sure you are counted. Census takers are legally bound to protect your information and will have a photo ID badge and may also have bags or other equipment with the Census 2020 logo.

Participation in the 2020 Census is important to the future of our community and getting a complete and accurate count requires everyone's help! Please take the time to make sure your household is represented in the count for Sugar Hill.
