## 2019 Bowl Summer Concert Series

The Bowl at Sugar Hill will host another all-star lineup for the 2019 concert series, which kicks off May 4th. This year promises a unique concert experience for music lovers of all ages and tastes.

The 2019 season at The Bowl opens with Trace Adkins and Clint Black featuring John Berry on May 4th as part of their national Hits. Hats. History Tour. Adkins has sold over 11 million albums and has over 1 billion plays on Spotify. Black, one of the most successful singer/songwriters in the modern era, has over three-dozen chart toppers and twenty two #1 singles.

Rock and Roll Hall of Fame inductees Joan Jett and the Blackhearts will take the stage on June 1st with megahits "I Love Rock 'n Roll," "I Hate Myself for Loving You," and other familiar tunes. On August 3rd, The Bowl will get a blast from the past as multiplatinum jazz-rock band Blood, Sweat, & Tears play their power hits from the late 1960s. Although tickets for both the Trace Adkins/Clint Black and Joan Jett and the Blackhearts shows are sold out, tickets for Blood, Sweat & Tears are still available.

A unique concert venue, the award-winning Bowl at Sugar Hill is known for bringing big name acts to an intimate performance space right in downtown Sugar Hill. The Bowl allows concert goers to bring in food and drinks (no glass) in small coolers, and offers food and drink sales on-site. New restaurants in the nearby E Center including Central City Tavern, Rushing Trading Company, Crazy Dough's Pizza, and the soon-to-open Indio Brewing will also be open for concert season.

# Downtown Projects



## The Broadstone

Several new residential projects are in various stages of development in downtown Sugar Hill. The Broadstone, located directly across from City Hall on West Broad Street, will bring 300+ residential units to downtown Sugar Hill as well as a 6,000 SF restaurant with outdoor seating. This development will also be home to the Sugar Hill community art gallery and the Sugar Hill history museum. The Broadstone represents a \$78 million private investment in downtown and will include high-quality amenities for residents, prominent public art, and water features as part of the downtown streetscape.



## Prestwick

Another project located at the corner of Hillcrest Drive and Highway 20 across from Sugar Hill Church will bring \$45 million in private investment and another 300 residential units within walking distance of downtown. The Prestwick development will offer multiple housing options including urban style apartments and two “big house” concept buildings that resemble large homes divided into individual living spaces. Streetscape retail is also part of the project as well as a brewpub, pool, and other amenities for residents. Sculptures and water features will also be incorporated into the project.

# Mosquito Spraying

Early in the mosquito season, the City of Sugar Hill dispenses larvicide tablets in areas of stagnant or standing water to minimize the the spread of mosquito-borne illnesses and prevent new generations of mosquitoes from forming. We also conduct two rounds of community-wide sprayings to apply an environmentally safe, US EPA-registered insecticide. The insecticide “fog” is sprayed at midnight. The fog diminishes and becomes harmless with sunlight and water, killing the mosquitos while the city sleeps. Scheduled sprayings are listed below:

## Summer Mosquito Spraying Schedule (Round 1):

- Week of May 13th – Streets & Subdivisions North of Hwy.20
- Week of May 20th – Streets & Subdivisions South of Hwy. 20

## Summer Mosquito Spraying Schedule (Round 2):

- Week of July 15th – Streets & Subdivisions North of Hwy. 20
- Week of July 22nd – Streets & Subdivisions South of Hwy. 20
