

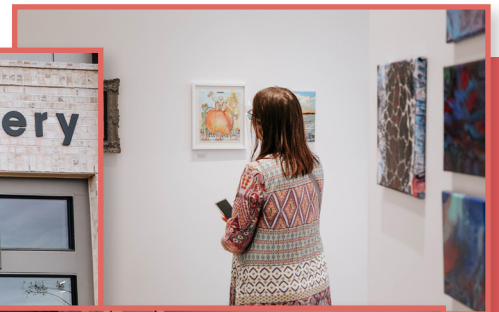

Opening of Sugar Hill's Art Gallery & History Museum

On Thursday, February 25, 2021, leaders from contributing Sugar Hill Community Groups, City Council, and staff gathered with Mayor Steve Edwards for an intimate and socially distanced ribbon cutting ceremony to celebrate the opening of the Sugar Hill Art Gallery and History Museum.

The History Museum offers permanent and special exhibitions of a large collection of items gathered, researched, and displayed by the Sugar Hill Historic Preservation Society (SHHPS). The current special exhibition in partnership with the Black Women's Association of Sugar Hill focuses on the first Black families in Sugar Hill in honor and celebration of Black History Month. Additionally, this space offers a research room for visitors to investigate their genealogical history thanks to a partnership with and sponsorship by the Suwanee Creek Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution. Beside the museum, the Art Gallery offers a unique, bright space for visitors to enjoy an eclectic mix of changeable featured works from local and non-local artists. The space will also host traveling exhibitions on a regular basis as curated by the Sugar Hill Arts Commission. The gallery's first show features small works available for purchase including photography, mixed media, pottery, and sculpture.
